VEHICLE PURSUIT REPORT Calendar Year 2020

In 2020, Town & Country Police Department (TCPD) was involved in 7 vehicular pursuits. Each pursuit is monitored by a supervisor with the objective to weigh the totality of circumstances with the risks of continuity and overall public safety. Subsequently, the pursuit is reviewed, evaluated, investigated (if necessary), and documented by a Command Officer holding the rank of Lieutenant or higher. Every incident involving a vehicular pursuit includes a case report, suspect(s) pedigree, type of offense, speeds of vehicles involved, weather and traffic conditions, time of day, day of week, roadway conditions, and number of officers involved.

Of the 7 pursuits which occurred in 2020, all 7 were determined to be within standards of TCPD policies and procedures.
