

**CITY OF TOWN AND COUNTRY
RESOLUTION NO. R02-2022**

**A RESOLUTION PLACING A TEMPORARY MORATORIUM ON PRIVATE STREET
ACCEPTANCE BY THE CITY OF TOWN AND COUNTRY EFFECTIVE IMMEDIATELY
AND VALID THROUGH CALENDAR YEAR 2022**

WHEREAS, the Board of Aldermen adopted Ordinance No. 1985 in 1996 which initiated the Private Street Acceptance Program (the "Program") and subsequent updates to the related Guidelines for Acceptance of Streets for Maintenance by the City of Town and Country ("the Policy"), with the most recent being by Ordinance No. 4069 in February of 2017; and

WHEREAS, the City's Public Works Department and Public Works Commission desire to review the Program and its Policy for acceptance and bring forth recommendations regarding same;

WHEREAS, a temporary moratorium will allow the Public Works Department and Commission to complete and review an audited assessment of public street conditions, as well as establish updated standards for maintenance; and


WHEREAS, the Commission recommended approval of the moratorium with the below conditions at its April 18, 2022 meeting.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF TOWN & COUNTRY, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. A temporary moratorium of any private street being turned over to the City for public maintenance will be placed until the end of calendar year 2022, unless formal revisions are adopted by ordinance sooner. The moratorium shall only be extended upon further action by the Board of Aldermen.

Section 2. The moratorium is to be effective on the below noted date of passage and will not include any applications currently in process as of the same date.
